

Neath Canal Restoration at Resolven receives Civic Trust '25 Years of Restoration in Wales Award' - March 2009

News.

Civic Trust Award.

Over 100 buildings and public spaces have received Awards, Commendations and Mentions in the 50th. Anniversary Civic Trust Awards. The winners were announced to an audience of over 480 at the Emirates Stadium, London on 18th. March 2009. The 50th. Anniversary celebration was hosted by Griff Rhys Jones, President of the Civic Trust. There were 6 Civic Trust award Winners in Wales:

What are Special Awards? – each year, a series of prestigious Special Awards are awarded to outstanding schemes. These are given to schemes which show excellence in a specific category or field and are sponsored by supporters. Winners receive a plaque and certificate. The Neath Canal Award was sponsored by Cadw and the Welsh Assembly Government.

Thomas Dadford.

As mentioned in the last Newsletter, new rulings have been applied to trip boats carrying 12 passengers or less. All boat crews have to be trained and tested in boat handling, health & safety etc. After many phone calls, meetings and discussions over the winter months with the various bodies qualified to train and assess, Gareth Hughes has agreed to become our trainer and assessor. He will attend a course in London at the end of April and then he will then be qualified to train 'Thomas Dadford' crew members and award them the necessary certificate. Gareth will also be qualified to train other people who wish to use the canals. We will be contacting all boat crew members as soon as Gareth is qualified and able to start training.

This means that the 'Thomas Dadford' will not be starting public trips at Easter this year. Trips will not start until the crews have been trained and members will be notified of the starting date when it is known.

There are also a number of maintenance issues involved with the boat e.g. the engine, which will have to be resolved before boat trips can commence.

Neath Canal at Resolven.

The Trust is keeping an eye on the state of the Neath Canal at Resolven. One of our members reports that it needs quite a lot of maintenance and there has been a towpath 'wash-out' near Crugiau Lock. Ty Banc Cottage remains empty.

Aberdulais Basin has recently been de-weeded and the surrounding grass cut. The Trust rents the Basin from the Tennant Canal Company.

The National Trust Site at Aberdulais Falls reopens for the summer season soon (it only opens at weekends in the winter)

Tonna.

The new wall and artwork recently built for the Tonna Woodland Project, near St. Ann's Terrace, Tonna, looks excellent and greatly enhances the area.
